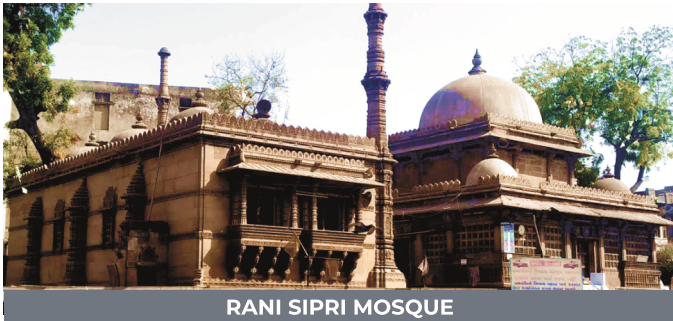


MOSQUE & TOMB TOURS



RANI SIPRI MOSQUE

Rani Sipri Mosque built in 1514 by Sultan Mahmud Begada's Hindu queen Sipri, is a memorial mosque blending Indo-Islamic stone carving, prayer space, and royal devotion in delicate lattice and domes.



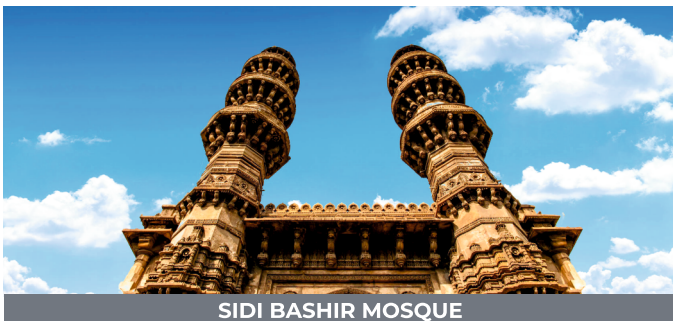
SHAHI PATHHARVALI MOSQUE

Shahi Pathharvali Mosque built 1693 by Shaikh Haji Mohammad Chishti; carved stone mosque once with madrasa, continuing as worship, learning, and community space.

Muhafiz Khan's Mosque completed 1465; elegant minarets and carved arches showcase Sultanate architecture, serving as Friday Mosque anchoring community identity and devotion.

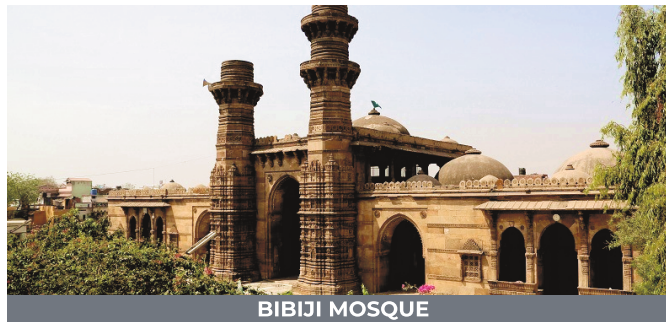


MUHAFIZ KHAN'S MOSQUE



SIDI BASHIR MOSQUE

Sidi Bashir Mosque built in the 16th century, is famous for its "Shaking Minarets," built as a congregational mosque and engineering marvel demonstrating vibration-responsive stone construction.



BIBIJI MOSQUE

Bibiji Mosque 16th-century neighborhood mosque in Gomtipur, commissioned by local patrons; its jhulta minarets showcase earthquake-resistant engineering and support daily congregational community prayers.



DARIYA KHAN TOMB

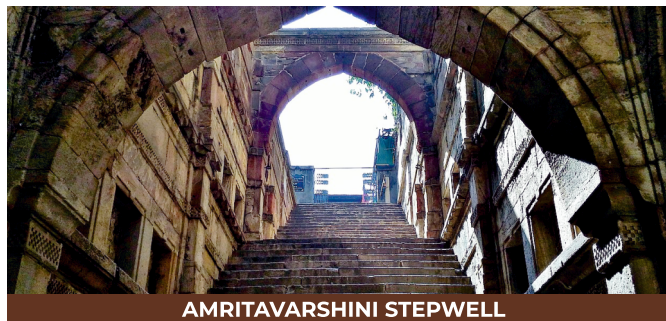
Dariya Khan Tomb raised in the 15th century for a noble and minister of Sultan Mahmud Begada, honors his memory. it is one of the largest unsupported dome structures in India.

Rani Rupmati Mosque mid-15th-century royal mosque with elegant domes, jali screens, balconies, and Sultanate-era refinement.



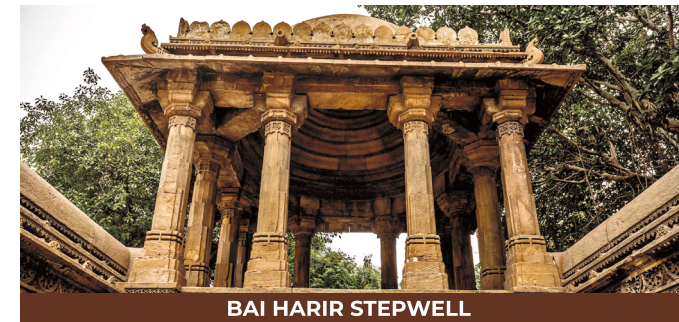

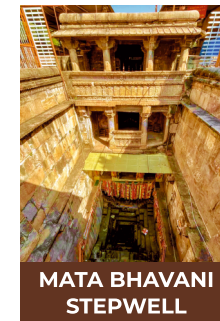
AMRITAVARSHINI STEPWELL

Amritavarshini Stepwell built in 1723 by diwan Raghunath Das, stored sweet water for travelers and residents, its triple-storeyed arcades and shrines offering both practical relief from heat and a setting for worship.



BAI HARIR STEPWELL

Bai Harir Stepwell built in 1499 by Bai Harir, a royal housekeeper under Mahmud Begada, conserved water and offered travelers a cool, devotional retreat through carved pillars, platforms, and chambers.



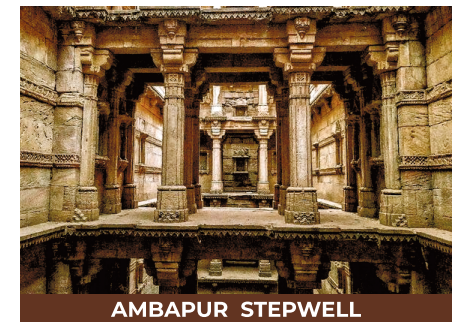
MATA BHAVANI STEPWELL

Mata Bhavani Stepwell a medieval shrine-stepwell dedicated to Goddess Bhavani, was sponsored by local Hindu patrons to combine sacred worship with reliable water storage.

Jethabhai's Stepwell a 19th-century philanthropic project by merchant Jethabhai, collected groundwater for surrounding neighborhoods.



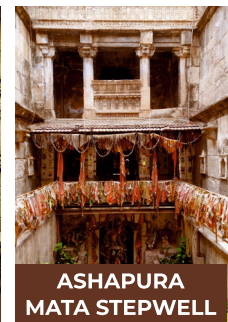
JETHABHAI'S STEPWELL



AMBAPUR STEPWELL

Ambapur Stepwell 15th-century stepwell linked to Queen Rudabai; descending sculpted levels cool air and guide villagers to water, shrines, and communal space.

Ashapura Mata Stepwell beautifully carved stepwell dedicated to Goddess Ashapura, reflecting Gujarati craftsmanship while serving as sacred water source and community gathering place.

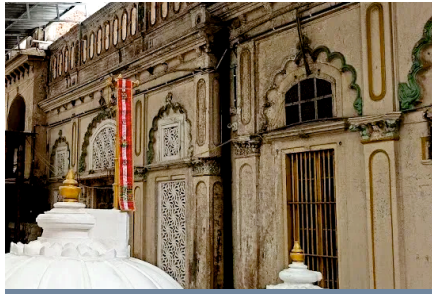


HUTHEESING JAIN TEMPLE

Hutheesing Jain Temple built in 1848 by Shethani Harkunvar in memory of Sheth Hutheesing, this marble Jain temple honors Lord Dharmanath's devotion and artistry.

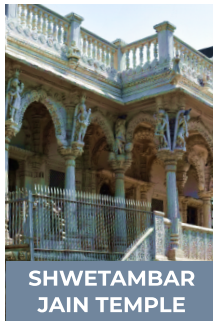
SAMBHAVNATH NI KHADKI

Chintamani Parshwanath built 1621–1625 by Shantidas and Vardhman, symbolizing Jain devotion and Mughal-era religious continuity.

Sambhavnath ni Khadki founded 1662 and rebuilt in marble in 1904, this compact partly underground Jain sanctuary supports meditation, worship, and community ceremonies.

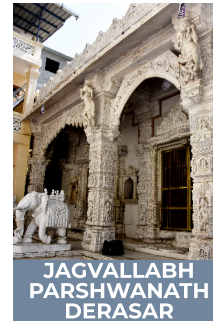

Mahaveer Swami Jain Temple 19th-century Jain shrine with carved domes, murals, daily puja, festivals, and serene reflection.

Shwetambar Jain Temple 19th-century Shwetambar Jain temple with carved halls, sacred images, worship, and community life.

Ashtapad Jain Derasar 19th-century marble temple by the Sarabhai family, inspired by Mount Ashtapad, enabling symbolic pilgrimage, meditation, and sacred local Jain worship.

Jagvallabh Parshwanath Derasar historic Jain temple venerating Parshwanath; carved domes and pillars support rituals, recitation, gatherings, and daily spiritual life shaped by merchant patronage.
